Biography of Baptiste Perrissin-Fabert, Deputy Director-General



Born on 4 December 1983, Baptiste Perrissin-Fabert is an *École Normale Supérieure* social sciences graduate and an engineer of the *Corps des Ponts des Eaux et des Forêts* senior civil service department responsible for the implementation of French public policy on sustainable development. He began his career as a researcher at the CIRED (the French Centre for International Research on Environment and Development), where he completed a doctoral thesis in climate economics on the "social value of carbon and the funding of the low-carbon transition" from September 2010 to December 2013. After working at the Sustainable Development division

of the Ministry of Ecological Transition (*Commissariat Général au Développement Durable - CGDD*) as a climate economist from January 2014 to October 2016, and then at *France Stratégie* (the French State Commission for Strategy and Foresight) as Head of the Sustainable Development Strategy Project from November 2016 to July 2017, he joined the Private Office of Brune Poirson, Minister of State, reporting to the Minister for the Ecological and Inclusive Transition, as Economic Adviser (July 2017 to December 2018) and then as Office Head (January 2019 to July 2020), where he notably supervised the drafting of the Anti-Waste Act for a Circular Economy. Then, at the beginning of 2021, he became the Special Adviser on "blue finance" for the Minister for the Sea. In April 2021, Baptiste Perrissin-Fabert joined the French Agency for Ecological Transition (ADEME) as Executive Director of Expertise and Programmes. At the same time, he was Acting Director-General during the interim period from September 2022 to October 2023. In October 2023, he was appointed Deputy Director-General responsible for Expertise.
